Director's Bio: Joe Dante began his career as an editor for indie film producer Roger Corman, making a directorial splash with the low-budget *Hollywood Boulevard* (1976), followed by *Piranha* (1978) and *The Howling* (1980). His breakthrough film, *Gremlins* (1984), was Spielberg's Amblin Entertainment's first film, followed by *In-nerspace* (1987). Dante's films often mix fantastical storylines with comedic elements.

Joe Dante is a treasured, iconic American director. His body of work reflects his unique brand of creativity and intelligence, a delicious sense of humor and fearless originality.

That is why we honor him with the first "Sierra Spirit Award." It's what our beautiful mountains and scenery are all about—beauty, risk-taking, reaching for your goals despite the challenges.

Joe Dante will be joined on stage by Robert Picardo (Star Trek Voyager), who appeared in many of Dante's classic films, for a look back at his career as of one of Hollywood's most beloved and successful film directors.

Director Bio: Matt Johnson was born in Toronto and studied film at York University. He co-created the series Nirvana the Band the Show (2009) and directed The Dirties (2013). Operation Avalanche is his second feature.

The inspiring story of Sonita Alizadeh, an 18-year-old Afghan refugee in Iran who thinks of Michael Jackson and Rihanna as her spiritual parents and dreams of becoming a big-name rapper. For the time being, her only fans are the other teenage girls in a Tehran shelter. Her family, however, has a very different future planned for her: as a bride she's worth \$9,000.



Iranian director Rokhsareh Ghaem Maghami poignantly shifts from observer to participant altering expectations as Sonita's story unfolds in an intimate and joyful portrait.

Director Bio: Rokhsareh Ghaem Maghami studied filmmaking and animation at the Tehran Art University. Her research on animated documentary resulted in writing a book: *Animated Documentary, a New Way to Express*. She has made six documentaries and won more than 20 international awards. *Cyanosis* (2007) and *Going up the Stairs* (2011) have had wide international exposure.



The story is focused on the physical changes an 11-year-old boy goes through and the frustrations it causes—he doesn't want to be noticed and belittled. He doesn't know what's happening to him. He can't accept that this transformation has begun. He



escapes into a fantasy world, a cruel fairy tale where his connection with his community and his mother— who is also unable to accept the changes in her son—seem to reach the ultimate breaking point. Baby Bump is a portrait of a child trapped in adolescence. It's a rarely acknowledged fact, but growing up really isn't for kids.

Director Bio: Kuba graduated from the Krzysztof Kieslowski Radio and Television Faculty at the University of Silesia and

from the Development Lab Feature Programme at the Andrzej Wajda Master School of Film Directing. He received a scholarship from the Ministry of Culture and National Heritage, and made the shorts *Don't be Afraid of the Dark Room* and *Twist & Blood*, which have received numerous awards.





A relentless, intimate portrait of the legendary Austrian movie star Helmut Berger. The man who epitomized beauty and the exuberant jet set lifestyle of the 70s now reigns over a run down two-room apartment at the outskirts of his hometown of Salzburg, Austria. In this small hideaway kingdom time seems to have stopped. Helmut's mood swings and sudden outbursts of aggression are reminiscent of actor Klaus Kinski's tirades. But the film exposes the brusqueness of his character for what it really is: a cry for attention and intimacy.



Director Bio: Andreas Horvath was born in Salzburg, Austria

in 1968. He studied photography in Vienna and multimedia art in Salzburg. Horvath's documentaries have received awards at international film festivals such as the Chicago International Documentary Film Festival, the Karlovy Vary IFF and the Max Ophüls Prize Festival. As a photographer Andreas Horvath has published black and white photo albums about Yakutia, Siberia and rural America. In 2013 Horvath received the Outstanding Artist Award from the Austrian Ministry of Art and Culture.

Struggling with a mid-life crisis, Robert leaves his psychology career to pursue photographing rare and exotic insects and moves from the United States to Colombia. On his journeys through the rain forests of the Amazon Basin, we watch as he forms a special bond with his subjects. This connection enables

him to make striking photographic images of new and undocumented species. Guided by his assistant Christian Lopez, he scours the forest for stunning insects. After more than 20 years of traveling, searching and photographing, his quest culminates with a New York City gallery show where he finally shares his images with the general public.

Director Bio: In 2011 Oelman produced a documentary about the annual Electric Daisy Carnival, The EDC Experience,

which premiered nationwide as a part of NCM Fathom Events. In 2012 he directed and produced the feature romantic comedy film Dear Sidewalk, starring Joe Mazzello and Michelle Forbes, which premiered at the Austin Film Festival. Learning To See premiered at the 2016 SXSW Film Festival.

As the family receives instruction on how to be the ideal patriots, Mansky's watchful camera captures telling details—from comrades struggling to stay awake during an official event to Zin-mi's tears at a particularly grueling dance lesson.

Director Bio: Born 1963 in the Ukraine, filmmaker Vitaly Mansky is one of the most acclaimed contemporary Russian documentary filmmakers and producers. His first film came out in 1989 and since then he has shot more than 30 films which have screened at festivals worldwide. Since 1996 Mansky has been working for various TV channels in Russia, popularizing documentary cinema on television. He is the producer of the national award Lavrovaya Vetv (Laurel Branch) for the best Russian documentary films, and president of the annual Moscow Documentary Film Festival Artdokfest. He is still collaborating with various studios and television channels in Russia and abroad as an independent producer. He currently lives in Latvia.

Five college friends on the cusp of 30 (in astrological terms their "Saturn return") reunite in Mammoth Lakes, California for a wedding of two of their group. 36 hours before the wedding the missing sixth friend of their group—the former best friend of the groom and the bride's ex-boyfriend—arrives unexpectedly, forcing everyone to question their lives and choices.

Director Bio: Shawn holds her B.F.A. in Acting and Directing from the University of North Carolina. She has acted in over

100 plays and directed 20 plays, including a Sam Shepard world-premiere for the MET Theatre in Los Angeles. Her short films have played in film festivals around the world. She sold a pitch to Warner Bros. and is a Sundance Producer's Lab Fellow and a Lincoln Center Theatre Lab-West Fellow.




